IS IT BEHAVIOUR OR IS IT SENSORY ???

Some children don't behave appropriately not because they won't, because they can't.

Sensory processing disorder is a complex neurological condition causing difficulties with processing information from senses.

Children with sensory processing disorders are frequently labelled as having behavioural problems, inattention, distractibility, motor coordination, hyper/ hypo sensitivities and panic attacks in the dental office . **NEUROLOGICAL TRAFFIC JAM OF SENSES**





• Have the child wear the x-ray vest during the entire appointment to provide deep pressure.

• Have the parent do oral deep pressure in the form of an electric tooth brush or mini massager prior to the appointment. • Use a firm touch whenever touching the child.

 Allow child to listen to calming music over headphones if the office noises or equipments noises are distressing. • Have the child wear a tight hat before and during treatment. • Allow the child to wear something that blocks the bright lights .
